






Coin of Antiochus Epiphanes. The Greek inscription reads 'Antiochus, image of God, bearer of victory'.

## Herod the Great

In around 36 BC Herod helped the Romans to capture Jerusalem and he became king of the whole of Israel. He was ruthless and cruel. He executed one of his wives, three of his sons, and the babies in Bethlehem at the birth of Jesus. He started to rebuild the Temple in Jerusalem (picture on the right). He died in 4 BC, and the land of Israel was then divided between his sons.
